

Mr. Georgakopoulos,

Democracy was set back at the ENOSIS "Elections" which took place on Sunday, November 14, 2010. The ENOSIS By-Laws were disregarded, rendering the "Elections" invalid, null and void.

Our Constitution, Article 21.3 provides that thirty (30) days prior to the Elections, all organizations are to provide their credentials. A screening committee, comprised of Chairman George Mavropoulos, George Chiagouris and Yiannis Angelopoulos, was appointed with Board approval to this end. At the Board Meeting, on November 3, 2010, Chairman George Mavropoulos requested that the list of names of all organizations be tendered to him in compliance with Article 21.3. Since there was no complete list available, Georgia Karas, the ENOSIS Office Manager, was asked to complete and provide the list by the end of the week. In repeated follow-up requests, the list was not provided to George Mavropoulos. Ms. Karas informed Mr. Mavropoulos that she could not provide him the list and that both he and George Chiagouris were replaced on the screening committee with Vassia Doumas and Debby Kydonakis.

On the date of the "Elections," no list was made available to the membership. Various organizations "signed up" on the day of the Elections and others were not allowed to "sign up", as decided by you and your appointed Credentials Committee. This committee which you put in place without Board approval. Article 21.6 (b) was not followed, in that the Credentials Committee did not produce in writing a list of proper delegates.

In accordance with the protocol established in prior elections, General Secretary, George Chiagouris attempted to start the meeting, but was prohibited by you. There was no establishment of a quorum prior to the commencement of the meeting. Objections regarding the thirty (30) day requirement were made by Attorney, Anna P. Kioutas, representing the Chicago Council of Justice for Cyprus. The Conference Committee Chairman, George Papadonakis did not entertain this issue after it had been brought up several times.

The ENOSIS Constitution, Article 9.9, allows officers to run for an office only "two times." You had already served two (2) terms. In fact, several weeks prior to elections, an attempt was made by the undersigned Board Members to call for a meeting to discuss the interpretation of Article 9.9 but you had objected to such a meeting and asked the rest of the Board Members not to attend, so that a quorum of 10 Board Members as required by the Constitution would not be present. Indeed, you succeeded in subverting the meeting. Therefore, Art. 9.9 rendered you an ineligible candidate. This issue was brought up at the General Assembly Meeting with an advisory letter written by the ENOSIS Legal Advisor, Louis A. Palivos, which was read. Yet, Chairman Papadonakis did not bring this matter up for discussion or for a vote.

Prior to the Elections, Attorney Cathy Hareas, Representative for Justice for Cyprus, requested that she be recognized to assert the point, that in order for proper Elections to take place pursuant to Article 21.7, an Election Committee had to be put into place. There was

such noise and chaos prior to the "Elections", that Chairman Papadonakis no longer had control of the meeting. Present in attendance were Community Leaders, Eleni Bousis, President of the Greek American Nursing Home and Rehabilitation Center and James Kozonis, Chairman of the Chicago-Athens Sister Cities Committee. Both spoke to Unity and Order. In fact, Judge James Booras, who had been in attendance, in an unofficial capacity, left prior to the "Elections." In the midst of the chaos, prior to the "Elections", Attorney Cathy Hareas approached the Assembly Committee, comprised of Chairman George Papadonakis, Vice-Chair Vasilios Mataragas and Secretary Eleni Moutidis, to bring up this issue of a lack of Election Committee, as provided by Article 9.7, which calls for the appointment of three Election Committee Members and two substitutes. Again, Mr. Papadonakis did not address this and with his two-member Committee, conducted Secret Ballot - Closed Door "Elections" for President.


Following the "Elections" of President, the "results" were: Demetrios Georgakopoulos, 30; and Louis A. Palivos, 26. Nominations for other officers were made with Chairman Papadonakis not soliciting any seconds. A few minutes later, the remaining officers were "named" with no Elections of any kind.

Mr. Georgakopoulos, may we caution and remind you of our cherished Hellenic History and our ancestors' quest for freedom, over three Millennia. Specifically, the Ottoman Occupation where our ancestors were suppressed with no voice for 400 years. A time came to unite and to eliminate the unjust and pave a path for the future. We take strong objection to your comment during your opening remarks towards us, "φωτια και τσεκουρι στους προσκυνημενους," translated, "fire and ax to the traitors." We consider your comment as: 1) A cowardly attempt to stifle the voice of the Hellenic Community which is a deliberate breach of the democratic process; 2) A slap in the face of our ancestors and to the gift they gave to the World we call Hellenism; and 3) A contradiction to the established By-Laws and specifically a violation of Article 23.1, which renders you unfit to be President.

We call upon the ENOSIS Membership to declare the "Elections" invalid.
